Eyeball is round, resembles treat of cow in

appearance and originates from all five elements (panchmahabhuta as with their attributes). Its muscular portion is contributed by earth (bhu).

Blood from fire (agni)

Black portion by air (vayu),

White portion by water (jala)

Tear channels by ether (akasha),

The black portion of eye (krisna mandala) is said to be one third of transverse extent of eyeball, dristi is only one seventh of this black portion.
